7. CAA consultation survey. This is to find out if modellers agree or not to proposed changes to future rules. Martin explained some of them:
  - a) RID (Remote I/D) involves fitting of a tracker in your model to tell everyone exactly where your model is so that other flying machines can avoid 'mid airs' (e.g. drones carrying drugs between hospitals or companies delivering goods). These trackers will cost between £100 - £500 + operating costs around £10 per month.
  - b) Geo fencing which will stop models flying in to controlled air space.
  - c) The 'C' categories of drones depends on weight/speed etc.
  - d) Distances from buildings may change.
  - e) Only models over 29kg MUST be insured.Some of these may not come into force before 2028.
